

Making and answering calls **Answering calls** Answering calls using the handset When your keystation rings, or ▶ flashes beside an Intercom or line key: 1. Lift the handset. Press the key beside the flashing before lifting the handset. Answering calls using Handsfree When your keystation rings, or ▶ flashes beside an Intercom or line key: 1. Press Handsfree . **Making calls** Depending upon the dialling mode programmed on your keystation, you may have to lift the handset before making a call. Line External calls using numbered line keys 1. If you do not have an external Prime line, press a line key. 2. Dial your call. Intercom External calls using Intercom keys 1. Lift the handset. 2. If ▶ appears beside an Intercom key, enter a line pool access code. 0R Press an Intercom key without ▶, then enter a line pool access code. 3. When you hear external dial tone, dial your call. Internal calls using Intercom keys 1. If you do not have an internal Prime line, press Intercom 2. Dial your call. **Note:** Line pool access codes and station numbers are supplied by your System Administrator. Making calls using Handsfree 1. Press Handsfree instead of lifting the handset. Hold Holding Calls The ► flashes beside the line on hold. 1. Press Hold 2. Press the line key with the flashing ▶ to return to the call. Calls are put on hold automatically when you switch from one line to another. Exclusive hold Use Exclusive Hold (Feature) to keep a call on hold private. Hold

Handsfree

System Administrator can program Handsfree for your keystation.

Switching between Handsfree and handset


- 1. Press Handsfree and replace the handset to switch to Handsfree.
- 2. Pick up the handset to switch back.

Using Mute

- Handsfree to turn the microphone OFF. 1. Press
- 2. Press again to turn the microphone ON.

Programming memory keys

About memory keys



Memory keys store telephone numbers or feature codes to give you one-touch dialling or feature activation.

There are two types of memory keys: single-memory and dual-memory.

Dual-memory keys

To use the **bottom** function, press the dual-memory key.

To use the **top** function, press the shift key, then press the dualmemory key.

Single-memory keys Single-memory keys are the keys with indicators other than line or Handsfree keys.

Remember: Press Feature * o to check a memory or line key.

External Autodial

- Programming memory 1. If you are on a call or an open line 1. If you are on a call or an open line with with dial tone, press dial tone, press or Ris
 - Hold 2. Press Feature * 1.
 - 3. Press a memory key.
 - 4. Dial the external number.
 - 5. Press OK to store the number.
 - 6. Label your new key.

Features

Erasing memory keys

- 1. If you are on a call or an open line 1. If you are on a call or an open line with with dial tone, press dial tone, press or Ris. or Ris Hold Hold

- 3. Press the memory key you want to erase.
